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1. GENERAL RULES FOR SELECTION OF PROJECTS TO BE FINANCED UNDER THE ANNUAL PROGRAMME

In conformity with article 23 of Council Decision 574/2007/CE establishing the External Borders Fund, the Responsible Authority develops Annual Programmes which are compliant with the Multi-annual Programme.

In this perspective, the Department of Public Security of the Ministry of Interior, in order to develop the 2008 Annual Programme as well as those of the following years, considered it appropriate to make use of the same inter-institutional network which was used to set up the Multi-annual Programme. This took place through the involvement of the *Drafting Group* which is made up of representatives from Ministry of Interior, the Italian Navy, the Guardia di Finanza (Italian Law enforcement body under the authority of the Minister of Economy and Finance), the Coast Guard, the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Carabinieri Force.

As the actions financed by the External Borders Fund listed in this Programme have to be implemented by other national authorities leaving no choice as to who will implement the action, the method of implementation chosen is the Responsible Authority acting as executing body. For this reason, the decision on the selection of the projects is taken by the Responsible Authority itself, which, in association with the other national authorities, will be considered as the final beneficiary.

A single procedure has been established to develop the Annual Programme and select the related projects:

- 1) The *Drafting Group* receives the final list of actions necessary to achieve the Multi-annual Programme's objectives from the potential beneficiaries, in accordance to the already identified priorities and Responsible Authority's strategic guidelines;
- 2) The *Drafting Group* presents the Responsible Authority with the project priorities which are to be accomplished within the pertinent Annual Programme, after having previously assessed the eligibility of actions proposed by the Final Beneficiaries;
- 3) Once the assessment and selection of the project proposals is completed, the Responsible Authority asks the *Drafting Group* to lay out the Annual Programme and transmits it to the European Commission.

The selection criteria represent the instrument through which the Final Beneficiaries' project proposals are selected. These can be financed through the External Borders Fund following a standard form created by the Responsible Authority.

In a general view, the identified selection criteria can be divided into two macro-categories:

- 1) *Eligibility Criteria*: they aim at discarding all those project proposals which are lacking of those elements which are essential to obtain financing from the Fund.
- 2) *Evaluation Criteria*: they aim at ranking the eligible project proposals through the attribution of points and possible weights.

Given that the Final Beneficiaries have already been identified, the *Eligibility Criteria* are:

- Coherence with the Multi-annual Programme Priorities, with the Annual Programme Actions and with the Responsible Authority's strategic guidelines;
- Eligibility of costs;
- Eligibility of target groups.

As for the *Evaluation Criteria*, the following were identified:

- Project conformity with the Member state's situation and necessities;
- Implementation feasibility;
- Financial capacity/feasibility;
- Coherence/complementarities between the project proposals and other actions financed by the EU or by national programmes;
- Identification of adequate indicators for measuring the projects outcomes.

The timing of the evaluation and the role of the evaluators will be described in more details in the *Manual of the Procedures*, which is being prepared and will be finalized after a positive outcome of the MCS procedures assessment.

With respect to the actions amounting to the purchase of supplies and services, the procurement procedures envisaged will respect relevant national and European legislation namely Italian Legislative Decree 12 April 2006, n.163 (Nuovo Codice Appalti) and European Community Directives 2004/17/EC and 2004/18/EC.

NOTE: Since actions related to years 2007 and 2008 are actually executed within the same time window, their descriptions within the two years are very similar.

2. ACTIONS TO BE SUPPORTED BY THE PROGRAMME UNDER THE CHOSEN PRIORITIES

2.1 Actions implementing Priority 1: Support for the further gradual establishment of the common integrated border management system as regards the checks of persons at the surveillance of the external borders

2.1.1 Increase of the fleet of vehicles and of the observation equipment to patrol the unwatched land and sea borders

(Obj/A)

◆ Purpose and scope of the action

Making every possible effort to secure a consistent control of external borders, ensuring, by means of co-ordinated intervention plans, a prompt spotting of illegal immigrants crossing those borders.

Reduce illegal crossings by means of hiding the same inside transport means. 10-12 off-road vehicles and 4-5 patrol vehicles to be used at the Border Police

Offices which are most affected by illegal immigration.

Contribution to the improvements in efficiency and quality in the fight to illegal immigration by means of the purchase of 80 night vision systems to strengthen the controls and protect borders security more effectively.

2.1.2 Updating and strengthening of the monitoring system which collects and deals with data concerning legal and illegal immigration.

(Obj/E)

◆ Purpose and scope of the action

Improvement of the monitoring and analysis of migration flows through the integration of all the systems used by the Central Directorate for Immigration and Border Police to check and fight illegal immigration. (e.g. SIA-Bari / BCS /SIF / I-VIS – MIPG Web)

◆ Expected grant recipients

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is State Police

◆ Where appropriate, justification regarding projects implemented directly by the responsible authority as an executing body

2.1.3 To develop a Border Control System (BCS) like the one used for people transported by air, to check the information regarding travellers crossing sea borders.

(Obj/E)

◆ Purpose and scope of the action

To extend the benefits and opportunities offered by BCS also to sea frontiers to tighten controls and find effective ways of deterring illegal immigration according to E.U. Directive n. 2004/82.

◆ Expected grant recipients

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible

2.2 Actions implementing Priority 2: support for the development and implementation of the national components of a European Surveillance System for the external borders and of a permanent European Patrol Network at the southern maritime borders of the EU Member States.

2.2.1 Improving of satellite communications capability either onboard Navy patrol vessels involved in maritime operations for management of external maritime borders in order to tackle illegal immigration, or at ground anchor station for National Coordination Centre needs. Improving communication capability of Navy Coastal Radar Network with National Backbone Network and integration of both networks by means of digital radio links and IP/MPLS protocol implementation.

(Obj/A)

- ◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

Upgrade of Network Control Center (NCC) of “S.Rosa “ in Rome in order to achieve a spread necessary to implement future client of this network.

- ◆ **Expected grant recipients**

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is Italian Navy

2.2.2 Purchasing of EHF satellite equipments for Navy Coastal Radar Network sites

(Obj/A)

Acquisition of EHF satellite terminal for each Navy Coastal Radar site to achieve broadband satellite access across military national platform (SICRAL) in order to build a full meshed network between radar sites and the national operation centre. The EHF equipment will constitute both a valid backup of terrestrial link and a flexible tool to link vessels equipped with satellite terminals.

2.2.3 Fulfilment of the European Patrols Network Coastal Search Radar Network for the coverage of the central– northern Adriatic, western Liguria and western Sardinia.

(Obj/A)

◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

The fulfilment of the Guardia di Finanza coastal radar network aims at covering by surveillance all the national coastal areas currently restricted to certain flat. This project will give to the Local Operational and Coordination Point (LOC's) of the European Patrols Network and to the National Coordination Centre, where all the Administration involved in the managing of the illegal immigration are represented, a clear maritime situational awareness..

◆ **Expected grant recipients**

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is Guardia di Finanza

◆ **Where appropriate, justification regarding projects implemented directly by the responsible authority as an executing body**

The Responsible Authority acts as an executive body in relation to the action as it requires specific skills which exclusively pertain to the functions and institutional activities for which National Authority are exclusively competent (article 7,8 of Implementing Rules 2008/456/CE – SOLID/2008/2 REV).

◆ **Expected quantified results and indicators**

Capability extensions of the Guardia di Finanza command, control, communication and information system named C4I for the search and surveillance of specific maritime border areas in order to increase checks and optimise the use of Air-Naval Resources for prevention and for the fight against illegal trafficking carried out at sea. This action will extend the Italian capability to detect all the interesting targets and will be available for the 5 Local Operational and Coordination Point and, at the same time, available for the National Coordination Centre as indicated in the Multiannual programme at the

Para 2.1 and 2.2.

A 70 mile coverage of the central – northern Adriatic, western Liguria and western Sardinia coastlines, which happen to be the following LOC competent areas: Trieste, Genoa and Cagliari.

◆ **Complementarity with similar actions financed by other EC instruments, if appropriate**

This project is thought to complete the national coastal radar network in favour of the Local Operational and Coordination Point (Genova, Cagliari, Messina, Taranto, Trieste) of the European Patrols Network project. It will cover the areas outside the range of the Navy coastal radar network.

The total financial requirement for this action is 6,793 million euros for 2008. Community contribution is 50% of the total financial requirement.

2.2.4 Acquire 4 offshore patrol vessels.

(Obj/A)

◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

Increase the Coast Guard long range maritime patrol capability.

These are vessel class “300” specialized on patrolling and surveillance with any weather condition in high sea, that will be deployed primarily in Sicily and south Italy to counter illegal immigration including safety of life at sea activities .

◆ **Expected grant recipients**

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is Italian Coast Guard

◆ **Where appropriate, justification regarding projects implemented directly by the responsible authority as an executing body**

2.2.5 To supply all the territorial and frontier police offices with a common, shared, operating software, in order to obtain a consistent control to tackle illegal immigration.
(Obj/A) **immigration.**

◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

Creation of a common, shared platform offering the same effective instruments and simplifying the end-user practical approach. Development and extension of NCC (National Coordination Centre) structure to all the national area.

◆ **Expected grant recipients**

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is State Police

◆ **Where appropriate, justification regarding projects implemented directly by the responsible authority as an executing body**

2.2.6 Strengthening the transfer network infrastructure and extending SIA and VISA procedure to the benefit of the Immigration Offices and Border Police Offices operating in central and northern Italian regions.
(Obj/D)

◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

The presence and the expansion of transmission resources which are technologically more performing (optical fibre) will facilitate, by means of a broadband, the extension SIA procedure to all Border Police offices (see annex 4 to the Schengen Border Code) as well as the immigration authorities (State Police)

The need to have more technologically advanced resources to be allocated to the regions of central and northern Italy is due to the fact that only 20% of all illegal immigrants arrive at south Italian regions, whereas 80% enter illegally by not sufficiently surveilled land or sea routes of central and northern Italy. It will also give the possibility to use better the most technologically advanced devices to read biometrical data (VISA), electronic documents and to detect false and falsified documents. (See MAP 1.1.18 and 2.2 (Obj/D).

◆ **Expected grant recipients**

2.4.1 Visa application software development and maintenance.

◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

To update and maintain RMV 8.2x application software needed to process visa application; to allow the development of a new generation RMV 9.x visa software, up-to-date with current technological standards and able to support VIS functionalities (Specific priority 4/2)

◆ **Expected grant recipients**

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs

2.4.2 Visa system management, including networking and outsourcing services; user support services. (Specific priority 4/2)

2.4.3 Purchasing of IT hardware equipment and system software for supporting consular posts VISA activities, including fingerprint live scanning equipment

(Obj/C) needed to issue VIS visas. (Specific priority 4/2)

◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

To purchase hardware and system software required by the VIS programme; this

includes enhancements to the current hardware and system software platform in order to improve system availability, as well as purchase of fingerprint scanner devices for applicant enrolment at Consular Posts (CPs) required by VIS

◆ **Expected grant recipients**

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs

◆ **Where appropriate, justification regarding projects implemented directly by the responsible authority as an executing body**

The Responsible Authority acts as an executive body in relation to the action as it requires specific skills which exclusively pertain to the functions and institutional activities for which National Authority are exclusively competent (article 7,8 of Implementing Rules 2008/456/CE – SOLID/2008/2 REV).

◆ **Expected quantified results and indicators**

1) Purchasing of fingerprint live scanners for 4-4-2 flat scanning as required by VIS enrollment procedures at CPs; devices will be selected among those available on the market. Currently, tests are being carried out on products from Greenbit and CrossMatch; we expect a third provider such as Identix could qualify for the bid. As stated in MAP, we expect to buy in this first phase only devices needed to support roll-out in the first two regions, i.e. about 25 – 30 scanners.

2.5 Actions implementing Priority 5: support for effective and efficient application of relevant Community legal instruments in the field of external borders and visas, in particular the Schengen Borders Code and the European Code on Visas.

2.5.1 Development of a training programme based both on traditional and e-learning tools for education of CP operators on visa software and Schengen visa (Obj/B) regulations.

◆ **Purpose and scope of the action**

Development of a training programme based on traditional and e-learning tools for Consular Post and border personnel on Schengen EU legal instruments, with a special reference to the Schengen Border Code and Visa Code.

◆ **Expected grant recipients**

When the responsible Authority acts as executing body, it is the responsible Authority itself who is the final beneficiary legally speaking. The competent associated Authority, who is de facto the grant recipient, is Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs

◆ **Where appropriate, justification regarding projects implemented directly by the responsible authority as an executing body**

The Responsible Authority acts as an executive body in relation to the action as it requires specific skills which exclusively pertain to the functions and institutional activities for which National Authority are exclusively competent (article 7,8 of Implementing Rules 2008/456/CE – SOLID/2008/2 REV).

◆ **Expected quantified results and indicators**

1) Development and release of web-base training (WBT) tools covering Schengen visa procedures and usage of RMV I.S. for CP operators; 2) Development and execution of traditional (class-based) training on the same subjects.

◆ **Visibility of EC funding**

Appropriate visibility to the EC funding will be given by citing the EC co-funding and inserting the EC logo on all training tools and documentation.

◆ **Complementarity with similar actions financed by other EC instruments, if appropriate**

◆ **Financial Information**

The total financial requirement for this action is 0,380 million euros for 2008. Community contribution requested for 2008 is 0,19 million euros (50%).

4. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

4.1. Purpose of the technical assistance

In accordance with art.17 of Decision of Council 2007/574/CE, the Ministry of Interior intends to use Technical Assistance for the preparation, management, monitoring, assessment, information and control and to strengthen the administrative capacity for implementing External Borders Fund.

The Technical Assistance is organized in order to ensure support and coordination of activities related to management, payments, checks and contracts, based on the organizational structure outlined by the Responsible Authority. Therefore, it is aimed at supporting the

implementation and management of the Fund, monitoring and evaluating its progress and ensuring the use of efficient management and control procedures.

In particular, the Technical Assistance is finalized at:

- Providing technical and specialist support to Responsible Authority

It is an aid both in the planning phase, through the assistance in setting priorities, analysis procedures and defining of procedure for the selection of projects, and in implementation phase of the Programme.

The Technical Assistance provides support in defining and implementing procedures and operational tools that can optimize the management and timely implementation of interventions by all Final Beneficiaries involved, and in the detection of critical situations and identification of the appropriate lines of action to resolve them.

The implementation is supported by constant financial, physical and procedural monitoring activities, which are necessary to ensure the proper management of the Program and in supporting the preparation of tools and methodologies for carrying out financial controls and verifying the management and control systems.

In addition, the technical assistance supports the Administration in analyzing the impacts of interventions which are included in the Multi-annual programme.

- Providing technical and specialist support to Certification Authority

The technical support to the Certification Authority in monitoring the merits and fairness of expenditure statements received by Responsible Authority, through the establishment of procedures and operational instruments for the verification that these costs result from accounting systems reliable and are based on verifiable evidence, have been subjected to a check of eligibility on the basis of national legislation and community and have been selected according to pre-selection criteria (according to art. 31 of Decision of Council 2007/574/CE).

This activity is propedeutic the drafting, certification and submission of statements of expenditure to the European Commission by the Certification.

It also provides support in the definition of procedures and operational tools for recovering unduly spent amounts through the operations of compensation and reimbursement as a result of total or partial cancellation of contributions.

- Providing technical and specialist support to Audit Authority

It's an aid that will not affect directly the activities of auditing (spot checks and documentary), carried out independently by the staff of the Authority, but will assist the same in the definition of methodologies and operational instruments for carrying out activities audits. Audit Authority is responsible of these activities and in preparing the report at the end of each annual programme, opinions on the effective functioning of Management and Control System and reporting on the final balance (according to art. 32, par. 3, of Decision of Council 2007/574/CE).

The amount devoted to technical assistance for the year 2007 in accordance with the provisions of the Decision 2007/574/CE (art. 17), is equal to 7% of total annual co-financing.

The amounts destined to technical assistance could finance several different activities; for example the Member State, within the limits specified in Article 18 of the basic act, might allocate the resources, averagely, as follows:

- 55% of this amount might be used for expenditures relating to the preparation, selection, appraisal, management and monitoring of actions (including computer equipment and consumables);
- 20% of this amount might be used for expenditure relating to audits and on-the-spot checks of actions or projects (both carried out by the Responsible Authority and by the Audit Authority);
- 10% of this amount might be used for expenditure relating to evaluations of actions or projects;
- 5% of this amount expenditure relating to information, dissemination and transparency in relation to actions;
- 10% of this amount might be used for expenditure on meetings of monitoring committees and sub-committees relating to the implementation of actions. This expenditure may also include the costs of experts and other participants in these committees, including third-country participants, where their presence is essential to the effective implementation of actions.

The procurement procedures envisaged for the technical assistance will respect relevant national and European legislation, namely Italian Legislative Decree 12 April 2006, n.163 (Nuovo Codice Appalti) and European Community Directives 2004/17/EC and 2004/18/EC.

4.2. Expected quantified results

Technical assistance will provide a valuable support to the Administration in the management of External Borders Fund, and contribute to proper management of the same, timely monitoring, information and control and to strengthening the administrative capacity and transfer of know - how.

The valuation process could be useful support to the administration in the analysis of the outcomes and the impacts of the Annual Programme.

4.3. Visibility of EC funding

As established by the European Commission, co-financing from the Fund should be immediately recognizable for each action activated in the EBF.

At the same time, also for Technical assistance, recipients of funding will be made aware of the need for adequate publicity for the Fund, to inform the government / bodies and their employees compared to co-financing of projects by the EIF and the obligation to include in each project information document attesting financing activities by the Fund, in accordance with the Decision of Council 2007/574/CE.

The Responsible Administration will provide information tools through broad and easy access (e.g. web site) to publish information on the Annual Programme on the actions undertaken under the External Borders Fund and on Final Beneficiaries according to art.33 (par. 2) of Decision of Council 2007/574/CE.

According to Art.34 of Decision of Commission C (2008) 789, 5 March 2008, the Final Beneficiaries will ensure adequate publicity of the activities and actions co financed by the EBF.

The Responsible Authority will perform an informative activity for the Multi-annual Programme and will diffuse the achievements of actions part of Programme.
